COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to prepare the student to utilize the nursing process in providing care for families during the childbearing phase of the life cycle. The childbearing phase includes the preconception, antepartum, intrapartum, postpartum and neonatal periods. The course examines physiological, psychological, socio-cultural and

developmental aspects of nursing care for the client. Emphasis is placed on critical thinking, clinical judgment, decision-making, and health education.

Clinical experiences provide an opportunity to apply theoretical knowledge in the performance of competencies, to become familiar with various technologies involved in the care of the client, and to develop skills in caring for individuals and families that promote optimal patient outcomes.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

Upon the completion of the course, the learner will:

1. Utilize the nursing process in providing physiological, psychological, socio-cultural and developmental care for individuals and families during the childbearing phase of the life cycle (1)
2. Integrate ethical, legal and regulatory standards of nursing practice that influence decision-making, in the care of individuals and families. (2)
3. Apply principles and concepts of human growth and development and knowledge of cultural factors that influence nursing care of individuals and families during the childbearing phase. (3)
4. Collaborate with colleagues and other members of the inter-professional health team to promote optimal health outcomes. (5)
5. Apply principles of teaching and learning for promotion, maintenance, and restoration of health for childbearing families. (6)
6. Apply critical thinking and decision making skills in management of care for individuals and families to achieve safe, cost effective outcomes. (7)
7. Apply communication skills and information technology in interacting with individuals and families during the childbearing phase. (4)

8. Apply evidence-based research findings in providing care for individuals and families during the childbearing phase. (8)

Clinical Requirements

1. All clinical requirements this includes health clearance, CPR certification, background check, drug screening (where indicated), and influenza vaccine (where indicated) must be completed before the start of each clinical rotation. A student not cleared for clinical cannot attend, and will be counted as absent.
2. A passing score of 90% on a dosage calculation competency exam is required prior to the start of all clinical courses. Students will be given three opportunities to pass a calculation exam. Students who do not pass the calculation exam will be dropped from the course.
3. Students are not allowed to bring a cell phone to the clinical area.
4. Absence for any reason from clinical will require making up the time missed. The method of making up missed time is at the discretion of the individual clinical instructor and course coordinator. A student is required to call the clinical instructor directly if he or she is going to be absent or late. Having another student inform the instructor is not acceptable.
5. Students are expected to be on time for clinical experiences in full proper uniform, and prepared to provide care. Failure to do so may result in being sent home and given an unexcused absence.
6. An unsatisfactory grade will be assigned on any clinical day in which any of the following behaviors are displayed:
An unexcused absence
7. Tardiness to or early departure from the clinical site, without prior clearance from clinical instructor.

8. A student is considered tardy when:
 - a. He or she is 10 minutes late.
 - b. Leaving the assigned clinical unit without informing and obtaining permission from the clinical faculty.
 - c. Inappropriately attired, please see the Division of Nursing dress code.
 - d. Inappropriate/unprofessional behavior in the clinical area.
 - e. Refusing a patient assignment without a valid reason.

Three unsatisfactory behaviors during a rotation will constitute a failure in the clinical course.

9. All students are expected to show evidence of safe practice. Evidence of unsafe practice can result in the removal of the student from the clinical area temporarily or permanently. Removal from the clinical area on the basis of unsafe practice is considered grounds for immediate failure. Unsafe practice is defined as the following:
 - a. Attending the clinical site while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
 - b. Failure to recognize the need for assistance, or to call for assistance when unprepared for nursing action.
 - c. Failure to take nursing action when such action is essential to the health and safety of the patient.
 - d. Performing nursing activities which are detrimental to the health and safety of the patient.

- e. Deliberately falsifying information regarding nursing care or patient status by verbal, written, or electronic report.
- f. Administering medications or performing sterile procedures without the supervision or permission of the instructor or the RN responsible for the care of the patient.
- g. Failure to assume responsibility for completing nursing actions required for the patient.

Clinical Objectives

Upon Completion of the clinical rotation each student should be able to:

Prepare for and participate in pre- and post-conference by researching appropriate resources, reviewing therapeutic skills, completing case presentations and assignments.

Establish effective rapport with his or her patient.

Obtain history and pertinent data systematically on assigned patient from a variety of sources including patients' paper or electronic records, nursing staff and provider.

Demonstrate an understanding of theory in the clinical setting through the process of critical thinking reflective of the biological, psychological and socio-cultural needs of individuals, families, and groups.

Demonstrate a complete assessment of patient status both adult and neonate, according to unit procedure and document appropriately.

Utilize the compiled data to formulate a nursing diagnosis.

Prepare a plan of care, set goals, evaluate patient's status for optimal outcome, and modify care according to patient needs.

Provide nursing care including the use of universal precautions for infection control and risk management for patient and student safety.

Accurately administer medications with knowledge of actions, side effects and safe dosage under supervision of clinical instructor or preceptor.

Assess patient and family baseline knowledge and conduct appropriate teaching.

Identify patient resources that can be used to promote and maintain health, and in resolving ineffective patient responses to nursing interventions.

Communicate appropriately and effectively using verbal, non-verbal, written communications, and emerging technology to clinical instructor or preceptor, and hospital personnel.

Function within the Patient's Bill of Rights and the Nurses' Code of Ethics, and maintain confidentiality of patient information according to HIPPA, agency, and professional standards.
